# REPORT ON LABOR FORCE SURVEY Quarter 4, 2016

Ha Noi, 2016

#### INTRODUCTION

On 17 December 2015, the General Director of General Statistic Office issued Decision No 1160/QD-TCTK on the 2016 Labor force survey, along with its survey plan. The purpose of the survey was to collect the information on 2016 labor market participation from those people who are 15 years old and above currently residing in Vietnam; regarded as a basic for aggregating and compiling national statistical indicators on labor, employment, unemployment and income. These results would support for ministries and branches assessing and comparing the changes in labor market among quarters within the reference year as well as with those of previous annual labor force surveys conducted by GSO. These results would be also considered as a basic to develop and plan policies on human resource development; activities of investment, production and business accordant with the development trend on labor market; as well as and apply International Labor Organization's updated access recommendations on labor and employment, especially in term of "labor underutilization" into the reality of Vietnam. The statistics would be aggregated quarterly for the national and regional levels; and yearly for the provincial level.

This report would present major findings of labor force survey in quarter 4, 2016 in order to provide information about labor market and employment for users. As a result of the survey coverage on labor market only relating to those people who were 15 years old, currently residing in Vietnam at the survey period, therefore, the indicators on labor and employment presented in this report would mainly be calculated for those persons aged 15 and above. However, due to the demand of researching, assessing and analyzing information about the labor market and employment situation for the working age group (including males aged from 15 to 59 and females aged from 15 to 54), the report would also provide some basic indicators on labor and employment for this group.

The 2016 Labor force survey has received technical supports of International Labor Organization (ILO). GSO highly appreciates these supports

and wishes to continuously receive more supports from ILO in succeeding surveys.

GSO hopes that this report will meet requirements of basic information for social economic policy markers, especially for those who are engaging into the field of labor and employment. We warmly welcome all constructive comments from readers.

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#### I. SUMMARY

As of Quarter 4, 2016 Vietnam has reached to 71.6 million persons aged 15 and above, of which 54.6 million people joined into the labor force (It is not included those people aged 15 and over who were currently not residing in Vietnam). Even the fact that the urbanization process has been going on, the rural labor force is continuously considered as dominant, currently accounting for 67,8% of total labor force.

The labor force participation rate stood at 76.8%. The difference on labor force participation between urban and rural areas has remained considerably, standing above 10 percentage points (70.2% against with 80.4%). As compared to Quarter 3, the labor force participation for both males and females has almost unchanged, ranging at 81.7% and 72.2%, respectively. The sex gap on labor force participation kept decreasing (from 9.6 percentage points of difference to 9.4 percentage points of difference) in Quarter 4.

As of Quarter 4, 2016 the labor force of whole country was constituted by 53.4 million employed laborers and approximate 1.2 million unemployed laborers.

The employment to population ratio of those people aged 15 and above was 75.2%. The gap on this ratio between urban and rural has still remained, currently standing at 11.1 percent points of difference. Of which that for urban was 68.0% and that for rural was 79.1%

Based on number of working hours, at the whole country, there were 801.7 thousand underemployed laborers. Number of underemployed laborers decreased with about 23.1 thousand persons lower than that of Quarter 3. In the other hand, an increase on proportion of underemployed laborers residing in rural areas could be seen (from 84.8% to 87.6%).

In Quarter 4, the general unemployment rate stood at 2.11 %. Accordingly, the unemployed population aged 15 and over decreased slightly with 10.4 thousand laborers lower as compared to that of previous quarter.

The young unemployment rate (for those people aged from 15 to 24) also decreased, as compared to that of Quarter 3 of the same year (7.28% versus 7,86%, respectively). Number of unemployed youth accounted for 50.9% of total unemployed population. Of which, the urban share was found lower than that of rural areas (43.3% versus 56.7%).

The underemployed youth has currently accounted for nearly a quarter (21.7%) of total underemployed population. Moreover, this share was likely increasing that needs more concerns

#### II. MAJOR INDINGS

#### 1. Labor force

#### 1.1 Size and distribution of labor force and labor force participation rate

As of Quarter 4, 2016, the labor force aged 15 and above in Vietnam reached to 54.6 million people. Despite of the increase on share for urban labor force, approximately 67.8% of the labor force in Vietnam has been residing in rural areas. Making a comparison among social economic regions, there were no considerable changes in proportion of labor force. The Red River Delta and the North Central and South Central Coast have remained as those two regions occupying with the largest shares (21.7% and 21.5%, respectively), followed by the Mekong River Delta (19.2%). Like that, these three regions accounted for 62.4 % of total labor force. Similarly, as of Quarter 4, 2016, females formed about 48.4% (equivalent to 26.4 million persons) to total labor force.



At the national level, the labor force participation rate was 76.8%. The urbanrural difference on labor force participation has remained - about 10.2 percentage points of difference (70.2% against with 80.4%). The labor force participation rate for females stood at 72.2%, with 9.5 percentage points lower than that for males (81.7%). Notably, the labor force participation rates for two mountainous regions, including the Northern Midlands and Mountains and the Central Highlands were found the highest (84.6% and 83.6%, respectively). Meanwhile, the lowest ones belonged to two regions namely the Red River Delta and the Southeast where two most developed social-economic centres of Vietnam, namely Hanoi and Hochiminh city are located. The labor force participation rates for two cities stood at 69.4% and 68.2%, respectively.

#### 1.2 Age structure of labor force

The distribution of the labor force by age group reveals not only the context of demographic fact but also of social-economic situation. The labor force of Vietnam is considered as relatively young, with the considerable share of the 15-39 year old group (currently accounting for 50.5% of total labor force).

There was considerable difference in age structure of the labor force between urban and rural areas (as shown in Figure 1). The shares of youth (aged 15-24 and elderly (aged 55 and above) living in urban areas were found lower than those of rural areas. In contrast, the proportion of prime working age group (aged 25-54) in urban areas was higher than that of rural areas. This pattern could reflect the fact that the urban youth has joined into the labor market later than the rural youth, due to their longer period of schooling. Meanwhile, the rural residents has joined earlier but stayed longer in the labor market, as a result of characteristics on rural jobs.

#### 2. Employment

Table 2 shows the employment proportion and the employment-to-population + ratio for those people aged 15 , classified by sex and 8 sampling domains (including 6 social-economic regions and 2 biggest cities) in Quarter 4 of 2016. Out of 53.4 million employed laborers, 68.2% (equivalent to 36.4 million persons) was residing in rural areas and employed females accounted for 48.5% (equivalent to 25.9 million persons). Making a comparison among social economic regions, the Red River Delta and the North and South Central Coast have currently occupied the largest relevant proportions, accounting for nearly 43.0 of total employed population; (standing at 21.7% and 21.3 % respectively), followed by the Mekong River Delta and the Southeast (19.1% and 17.1% respectively).

In details, as of Quarter 4, 2016, the employed population was estimated about 53.4 million people, increasing slightly with 133.2 thousand people (equivalent to nearly 0.25 %) as compared to that of Quarter 3.

Making a comparison among 6 social economic regions, the changes in employed population were quite different. In Quarter 4, the region whose number of employed laborers declined most (about more than 61 thousand persons or equivalent to -0.52% as compared to that of Quarter 3) was the Red River Delta, whereas the

Northern Midlands and Mountains and the North and South Central Coast were considered as those regions creating most job opportunities (their number of employed laborers increased with 92.5 and 60.7 thousand of persons or equivalent to 1.25% and 1.74%, respectively, as compared to that of Quarter 3).

As of Quarter 4, 2016 the employed-to-population ratio for those people aged 15 and above kept standing at 75.2%, almost unchanged as compared to that of Quarter 3 (75.1%). Urban-rural and sex gaps on this ratio have remained (11.1 and 9.1 percentage points of difference, respectively). Comparing among social economic regions indicated that the Northern Midlands and Mountains and the Central Highlands have occupied the highest ones (83.8% and 82.9%, respectively), while the lowest ratios belonged to the Red River Delta and the Southeast regions, where two most developed social- economic centres, namely Hanoi city and Hochiminh city are located. The ratios for two these cities were found decreasing continuously (about 68.4 % and 66.1 %, respectively)

Figure 2 presents the proportion of employed population classified by industrial sector for each sampling domain. The data shows that the Southeast region, especially including Hochiminh city, has the most advanced economic structure, with an increasing dominant proportion of industrial, constructional or service workers (about

86.9% of total employed population in this region). Contrarily, for the mountainous and coastal areas, the proportion of employed laborers engaging into agriculture, forestry and fishery has remained quite high. The Central Highlands has been regarded as the region occupying this largest proportion (about 74.5%), followed by the Northern Midlands and Mountains (64.0%).

#### 3. Underemployment and unemployment


#### 3.1 Underemployed and unemployed laborers

As of Quarter 4, 2016, the labor force aged 15 and above was constituted by nearly 0.8 million underemployed laborers and 1.15 million unemployed laborers. Both the underemployed laborers and unemployed laborers decreased as compared to those of Quarter 3, 2016 (about 23.1 and 10.4 thousand persons, respectively). Normally, the underemployment is considered more popular in rural areas. According to the result of Quarter 4, 2016, currently, about 87.6% of total underemployed population was residing in rural areas. Besides, the share of underemployed females was found higher than that of males (54.7% agaisnt with 45.3% of total underemployed population). On the other hand, the unemployment in urban areas should be concerned more even that the proportion of urban unemployed population was found lower, just accounting for 47.4% of total unemployed population (see part 3.2 – unemployment and underemployment rates for more reference). Moreover, the data of Quarter 4, 2016 also shows that unemployed males were more crowded than females (accounting for 53.5% versus

46.5% of total unemployed population).

Observing the unemployment by the technical/qualification attainment reveals that in Quarter 4, 2016, more than 39.8% of unemployed population has undergone technical/qualification training from 3 months or more. Among this group, those unemployed laborers, who have graduated from universities or above, occupied the largest share (about 47.7%).

The youth is considered as one labor group most vulnerable to the fluctuations in labor market. Thus, the youth's unemployment has become important issue that should be paid attention in the society. In quarter 4, 2016 the unemployed youth aged from 15-24 accounted for 50.9% of total unemployed population throughout the country. Remarkably, the share of unemployed youth residing in urban areas was found lower than that of rural areas (accounting for 47.4% against with 52.6% of total unemployed population), as a result of more educational and employment opportunities available in urban areas. In term of technical/qualification attainment, about 55.1% of total unemployed laborers who have undergone technical/qualification training from 3 months or more (equivalent to 252.5 thousand persons) were young ones. Of which, a dominant share (accounting for 80.5%) was formed by the young laborers who have graduated from college and higher.

In addition, about 21.7% (equivalent to 173.8 thousand persons) of total 801.7 thousand under-employed workers throughout the country were young persons aged 15

#### 3.2 Underemployment rate and unemployment rate

The working age underemployment and unemployment rates are referred to those females who are from 15 to 54 years old and those males who are from 15 to 59 years old.

As of quarter 4, 2016, the working age unemployment rate for the whole country reached to 2.31%. Of which, the urban unemployment rate (standing at 3.24%) was found higher than that of rural areas (1.84%). The sex gap on unemployment rate was not considerable. However, among regions, the unemployment rates were quite different. The region occupying the lowest rate was the Northern Midlands and Mountains (about 0.92% - equal to 2.5 times lower than that of whole country - 2,31%); followed by the Central Highlands (standing at 0.95%). The highest unemployment rates belonged to the North and South Central Coast and the Mekong River Delta, (3.42% and 2.84%, respectively).

In Quarter 4, 2016 the working age under-employment rate for the whole country decreased slightly as compared to that of Quarter 3 in the same year, (1.60% versus 1.66%, respectively). The working age underemployment rate in rural areas stood at 2.10%, equal to nearly 3.6 times higher than that of urban areas (0,59%). The difference on this rate has existed among regions. The Mekong River Delta has remained

occupying the highest rate (2.89% - equivalent to 1.8 times higher than that of whole country – currently standing at 1.60%).

The working age unemployment rate has unchanged considerably between Quarter 3 and Quarter 4, 2016 (declining slightly from 2.34% to 2.31%, respectively). However, if compared to the same period of 2015, the working age unemployment rate of Quarter 4, 2016 was 0.13 percent points higher (2.18% against with 2.31%). This could be explained in part by the fact that Vietnam is an agricultural country, characterized with the less developed economy, resulting to the people's low living standards and the insufficiently developed social security system. Therefore, people prefer involving into any kind of jobs, even into the informal ones giving unstable, low earnings and indecent working conditions, in order to support themselves and their families, rather than being into long-term unemployment to look for better jobs.

The young unemployment rate calculated for those persons aged 15-24. In urban areas, the youth's unemployment rate was found 6 times higher than that of those people aged 25 and above (11.49 % versus 1.90%). As compared to Quarter 3, there were opposite changes in this rate between two groups. In details, the youth's unemployment rate decreased while this rate increased slightly for those persons aged 25 and above (-0.58 and 0.1 percent points, respectively).

In Quarter 4, 2016, the unemployment rate of young group who have completed technical/qualification training from 3 months or more, stood at 15.2%, of which the unemployment for young females was higher than that rate of young males (16.4% versus 13.8%). The urban-rural gap in this rate has remained about 3.3 percent points of difference (17.0% against with 13.7%, respectively). Notably, the youth's unemployment is likely increasing along with their level of technical/qualification attainment, that is, more concerns on unemployment should be paid for those young people who have attained high technical/qualification level. For example, the unemployment rates of those young people who have graduated from college or university and above were found about 16.0% and 23.0%, respectively. Whereas this rate was much lower for those groups who have just completed "short-term vocational education" or "mid-term vocational/professional education (standing at 3.9% and 10.4%). The reason could be that those young people having high educational attainment (such as college, university or above) are often from 20 to 24 years old, have just graduated and lack of experiences. Therefore, they will meet difficult to find suitable jobs.
